We are really "blowin' and goin' this year! More projects have been completed. Here's a recap of the efforts:

Fundraising

NM State Association raised \$550.00 through its T-Shirt sales to help support the legislative efforts. This is great but we're shy in sales by about \$300.00 to help pay for the lobbyist. Please contact either Judy Anderson or me for helping to raise money for the legislative campaign.

Legislative

I won't steal Judy Anderson's thunder here, but we've had a great legislative year so far. We've identified the bills of priority to watch. We're in constant contact with the lobbyist. I've been to the capitol on a number of occasions to talk with legislators. Did I mention that we have a lobbyist?????!!! Yes we do – his name is Ray Davenport. He has a website: www.rwdnet.com where you can find a listing of the bills we are watching and the links to get the bill text. By hiring Ray, we have joined the ranks of the "big boys" in fighting the nasty legislation. We are sharing the expense of Ray's services with NAIFA this year. My sincere "thank you" goes out to the board members of NM State Association of Health Underwriters, Rio Grande Association of Health Underwriters, and Northern NM Association of Health Underwriters for seeing the importance of the lobbyist and agreeing to share in the expenses.

The Day on the Hill was a great success. We had 75+ attendees, 12 of whom were legislators. Our speakers did a wonderful job and I believe the audience got a great deal of information from them. This was a combined effort with NAIFA and we plan to do it again next year. We hope to make the event even bigger and better next year. It will be held in February again so be looking for the date to put it on your calendar. The legislators were happy to see and hear from us and happy to know that we are very willing and able to help them pass good legislation.

Education

Membership Blitz

We're growing! This makes NAHU and me very happy. NM is within Region 7 by NAHU standards. Region 7 is the smallest region in the country, which means that our growth is the most meaningful. We had a membership telethon in January and recruited members to all the chapters. Check out Terry LeVois' section of this newsletter for the results.

Nationally

Capitol Conference is scheduled for March 22-25. Eight board members from all chapters will be attending this year. The conference is designed to keep us up-to-date on national legislative news and then we carry that news to our congressmen. Legislative Report

Thanks to all who participated, our *Day on the Hill* was a giant success. Special thanks are in order to Anne Sperling, who, among all her other duties, put invitations into each legislator's mailbox and coordinated the hotel arrangements with NAIFA. Thanks, also, to Marcie Abeyta who handled the RSVPs and to the entire Legislative Committee for calling each of our members. We're already looking forward to next year!

During this Legislative Session there have been a lot of health bills introduced, including a Single Payor System (the Health Security Act), mandates to (1) cover infertility diagnosis and treatment; (2) coverage for treatment of, and medical diets for, inborn errors of metabolism that involved amino acid, carbohydrate and fat metabolism; (3) coverage for smoking prevention and cessation. In addition there were several bills introduced regarding co-payments on prescription drugs, there were two bills introduced expanding dependent coverage to age 24 or age 26; several bills were introduced regarding tax credits for Long Term Care, there is a bill regarding tax credits to employers who pay a portion of the employees health insurance premium and bills cleaning up the NM Insurance Code. The HIFA Waiver (aka NM State Coverage Initiative) has apparently been stopped for the time being. No legislation was introduced asking for more money this session, but they will probably try to do so next session or do it through the regular Medicaid Budget. We are keeping careful tabs on this issue. All in all this has been a tremendously busy session. For complete information on pending bills please go to our lobbyist's website: RWDNet.com. Once there, click on the NAIFA/NAHU button which will take you to a list of introduced bills. Scrolling down the site you will find links such as locating the bill, reading the entire bill, etc. If you have any questions you can call me at (505) 888-7909.

Good News: We have EIGHT members going to the Capitol Conference. Appointments have already been set with Sen. Domenici and Sen. Wilson and we are working on the other three. The April Continuing Education program will include a report on the Capitol Conference and what was learned. The CE will be given by Anne Sperling. Please plan on attending this important meeting. Speaking of Conferences . . . remember that our National Convention will be June 29 to July 2 in San Diego. This promises to be a great experience for everyone who attends!

Legislatively, on the national level, the White House has promised a Medicare/prescription drug bill, but it hasn't materialized yet. The president's recent budget speech also touched on MSA's and health credits. As soon as we know more we will let you know. Recently, Rep. Jim Greenwood (R-PA) introduced the HEALTH Act (Help Efficient Accessible, Low-Cost, Timely Health Care), HR5, with support from Majority Leader Tom DeLay, Speaker of the House Dennis Hastert and almost 70 co-sponsors. The bill would limit the number of years a plaintiff has to file a health care liability action, establish a cap of \$250,000 on non-economic damages (i.e. pain and suffering) and place reasonable limits on punitive damages (the greater of two times the amount of economic damages awarded or \$250,000.) Last year, the act passed the House by a vote of 217-203 but was not taken up by the Senate. NAHU supported the bill last year and is backing it again this year. We will keep you apprised of this bill. Again, if you have any questions on this information please call me at (505) 888-7909.

A place where not only the patient, but the patient's family could get outside during a hospital stay without having to go downstairs six floors--a tricky feat when hooked up to life-supporting machines and confined to a hospital bed.

A place for Mom or Dad to sit outside in the mornings and drink a cup of coffee or tea after a long night of standing vigil over their sick child...but not so far away that a parent couldn't return to the room in seconds if something started to go wrong.

A place where Rachel and her brother, William, could have felt the sunshine on their faces as William held her hand or read her a story.

A warmer, more natural place for a child to die or for the family to say good-bye to a child who has passed on.

As the idea was discussed with hospital administrators, physicians, nurses and other caregivers, the vision began to include a playground, a place for the family and patient to experience a little childhood normalcy. A gathering spot where a teen-age patient could meet with friends. A safe place where a child and family could get away from painful and frightening medical procedures. No shots here.

The concept for Rachel's Courtyard was born and is now a very important part of Presbyterian's 2002-2003 construction project. It will be built adjacent to the pediatric unit on the sixth floor as an oversized balcony, or "playground in the sky" on the main hospital's west face.

Now comes the hard part--raising the \$1.2 million to make it a reality. To date, friends, family and members of the community have contributed over \$350,000 to help make this a reality. We need your help! As a member of this community, we ask you to consider donating to this worthy cause.

The following criteria will be used by the State and Local Boards to determine the Pat Miller Award (PMA) winners each year. The point basis for rating the nominee is listed beside each of the 11 categories and will be graded by the Boards upon review of all the submissions.

When preparing your nomination, please provide information on you nominee outlining these specific accomplishments and submit a supportive narrative based on the categories listed on the nomination criteria checklist.

Nomination Criteria Checklist and Point Basis

(2 yrs = 1 pt; 3-5 yrs=2 pts; 6-10 yrs = 3 pts; Over 10 yrs=5 pts.)

Must have served 2 years in following areas to qualify for points; which are accumulated:
Local Board (1 pt.) State Board (3 pts.)
Local Officer (2 pts.) State Officer (4 pts.)
- _____ 3. Served as Local and/or State President (accumulated)
Local President (5 pts.) State President (5 pts.)
- _____ 4. Actively participates in HU Association. Name committees served on and projects for the past 5 years. (1 point for each committee/project. i.e. Raspberry House, MS walk)

- _____ 5. Public Service and Community Activities (1-5 pts.)
(e.g. church activities, rotary clubs, service organizations)
- _____ 6. Attendance – Reg. & Natl. Conferences/Annual meetings (1-5 pts.)
- _____ 7. Other association and/or industry awards received
(1 pt. each, max 5 pts.)
- _____ 8. Professional Industry Designations (i.e. RHU, REBC, CLU, CEBS, HIA
(2 pts. for each designation)
- _____ 9. Committee Involvement (Local, State) (1 pt. for each served on, 3 pts. for each chaired, no limit on points)
- _____ 10. Industry involvement (1-5 pts.)
(e.g. serving on New Mexico insurance committees, special task force or other insurance industry boards)
- _____ 11. Miscellaneous (1-10 pts.)
(Points will be given for industry-related speaking engagements, articles published, radio and/or TV appearances, or Association Special Projects)

PAT MILLER AWARD presented for Distinguish Service

The New Mexico Association of Health Underwriters recognizes those of its membership who have performed special service at either the local or state level over an extended period of time through the presentation of The Pat Miller Awards (PMA). The state and/or local Awards Chairperson should assume responsibility in this area.

Distinguished Service Awards are presented to those persons who, in the option of the State and Local Boards, have contributed significantly above and beyond what is normally called for in connection with association volunteer services. The nominee's commitment of time, talent and finances to the advancement of the association and the health insurance industry should be exemplary.

Anyone who has been a member for two years and meets the PMA criteria is eligible. However, since this award is intended for outstanding service over an extended period of time, a member who has been awarded a PMA within the last five years is not eligible. The PMA isn't for everyone as it presents the pinnacle of the "personal best" concept.

To nominate your candidate, submit a detailed narrative summary, outlining your nominee's accomplishments to the State Awards Chair, accompanied by a nomination form postmarked no later than March 31, 2003.

Only one PMA will be given each year.

Eva Jean Fomalont Award Criteria

Description:

The EJF Award honors local New Mexico members who have attained positions and success with the local, regional and national levels of NAHU.

The EJF Award will be presented to those recipients who have shown outstanding commitment to the NAHU organization over the years and have fulfilled the various positions successfully by upholding the commitment of the voluntary position and carrying out the goals and objectives of each position held.

Commitment includes attending local chapter meetings, committee meetings, regional meetings and national meetings, effectively communicating the outcome of the meetings to the membership, and affecting positive change where necessary.

Criteria:

Anyone who has held a title of President of a Local Chapter, President of a State Chapter, Regional Title and National Title is eligible to receive the award. Also, the recipient must have a minimum of 10 years of service to NAHU, a minimum of 5 years of public and community service, has received the National Distinguished Service Award, and has received local Chapter or Regional Award(s).

Below is the Nomination Criteria Checklist and Point Basis. Only one EJF Award is given each year based on the criteria and points.

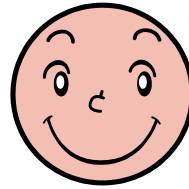
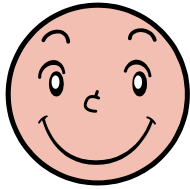
